# Taralga AP&H Association – Regulations

- 1) Entry fees as stated throughout this schedule. Camping facilities and amenities are also available, and fees as stated in this schedule.
- 2) All postal entries must be in the hands of the secretary on or before the Monday before the show. Pavilion entries may be left with the secretary no later than the Wednesday before the show, or otherwise taken personally by the exhibitor to the pavilion steward on Thursday afternoon between 3pm and 6pm and Friday morning between 8am and 10:30am. Pavilion judging will take place on Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> of March 2026 between 1pm and 3pm.
- 3) All exhibits shall be considered to be in the custody of the Committee during the hours of the show, and any exhibitor who (except as provided for in regulation) removes an exhibit without the permission of the secretary and the steward in charge before 3pm on the second day of the show, shall forfeit any prize which may have been awarded for such exhibit, if the exhibit in question is not awarded a prize, then the exhibitor shall be liable to a fine not less than 25c for each exhibit taken away and the Committee reserves the right to deduct such fine or fines from any prize money awarded to the exhibitor in any other class.
- 4) Exhibitors of livestock may, with permission of the steward in charge, remove such stock from the ground on the first night of the show, but stock so removed must return to the ground before 10am on the second day, failing to do so will impose penalties provided in regulation 3, which will be enforced.
- 5) All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor. All joint exhibitors must be members of a recognised partnership.
- 6) The age of all horses exhibited will be from the 1st of August.
- 7) All exhibitors of livestock must produce such proof of age as the judge may require, in the case of a disputed age in livestock, other than horses, the rule followed will be that adopted by the Royal Agriculture Society.
- 8) An exhibit of livestock may be entered in any number of classes, but upon being awarded a first place in any one class (except classes under a and b) shall be disqualified from gaining any further prizes, other than special prizes with the following exceptions:
  - Draught horses or mares winning first prize may compete as one or a pair or vice versa.
  - Winner of any class of gent's hack may compete as a lady's hack or vice versa; heifer winning as single heifer may compete as one of a pair or vice versa.
  - Single buggy horse or pony winning first prize in Hackneys or Harness classes may compete as one of a pair or vice versa.These conditions do not apply to hunters or trotters. Stallions will not be allowed to compete in miscellaneous events.
- 9) The farm, garden produce or sundries must be grown, manufactured, or raised by the exhibitor who may compete by exhibiting varieties, but any exhibitor who shall send any exhibit for competition which has not been grown, manufactured or raised by himself shall not be awarded a prize. Farm produce must be grown during the present season.
- 10) The judge may withhold any prize if they deem the exhibit does not warrant a prize or give a lesser prize in lieu of one stated. They may also award prizes without competition should they consider the exhibit worthy.
- 11) The judge may award a prize or certificate to any article not included

in the schedule, which they consider sufficiently deserving.

12) In all cases of disputes, the decision of the Committee shall be final, and all protests may be lodged within 24 hours of award with the secretary accompanied by a fee of \$1 to be forfeited if frivolous.

13) An exhibitor making himself known to be a judge or judges as an exhibitor of an article or interfering with the judges' decision shall be disqualified.

14) Any exhibitor accused of conduct calculated to bring the Association into discredit shall be called before the Committee at such time, and place as the committee shall determine and, if found guilty, shall be liable to all or any of the following penalties: Reprimand, Forfeiture of all prize money, trophies, etc. awarded Disqualification from exhibiting.

15) The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving reason.

16) No exhibitor or person in charge of an exhibit will be admitted to the showground free. Sideshows and stand will be allowed on the ground subject to the approval of the committee and upon payment of any sum they may deem fit to charge.

17) All horses and stock over the age of nine months to be led into the ring.

18) No stock of any description to be allowed loose on the showground after 9am. This rule is to be strictly enforced.

19) All dogs found loose on the ground may be destroyed.

20) The Committee expressly reserves the right to stop any objectionable performance or sideshow at any time during the continuance of the show.

21) All prize-winning horses capable of being led, driven, or ridden, must take part in the Grand Parade, except by special permission of the steward in charge. Infringement of this regulation shall render the defaulting exhibitor to forfeit all, or any prizes won.

22) The Association will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibitor or exhibit, and it shall be a condition of each entry that every exhibitor shall hold the Association blameless and indemnify it against legal proceedings arising out of any such accident. Whilst all reasonable care will be taken, the Association will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss or mis delivery or livestock or any other exhibit of any kind of any injury done thereto.

23) The word local in any class in this schedule shall be taken to mean residents of the Upper Lachlan Shire District and/or past or present members of the Taralga Pony Club that have attended at least one Pony Club camp.

24) Receipts will not be sent unless requested.

25) Waiver forms must be signed by all exhibitors and competitors.

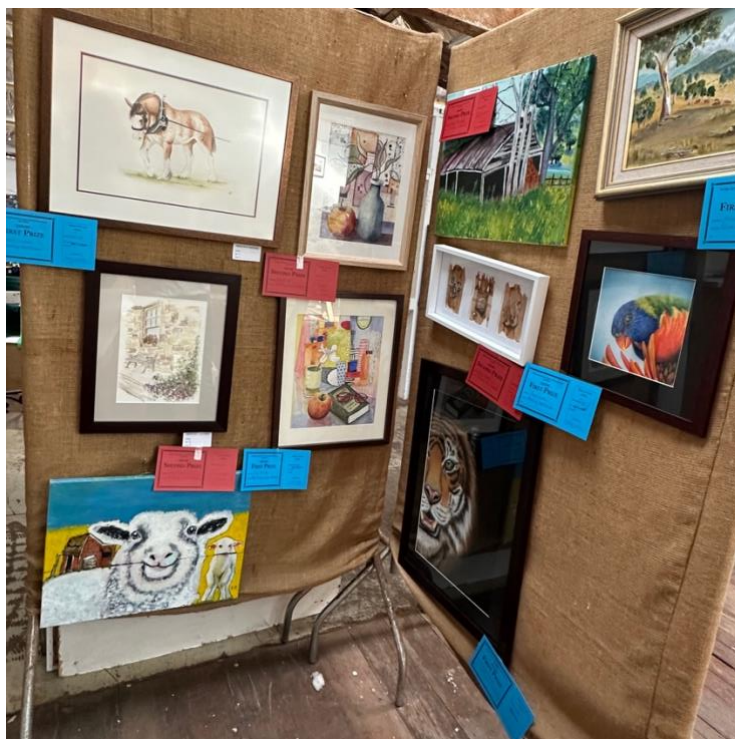

# The Agricultural Societies Council of NSW Dried Fruits Association

## Rich Fruit Cake Competition

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants

Here's what you need:

- 250g sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self-raising flour
- ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- ½ teaspoon almond essence
- ½ teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least an hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 to 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

**Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$25 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.**

**The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$50 and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.**

This competition is a wonderful opportunity to highlight the talent and dedication of exhibitors across our communities—bringing patchwork lovers together to celebrate creativity and craftsmanship.

**Prizemoney:** Prize money is sponsored by the AgShows NSW.  
Group final winning entries will receive a cash prize of \$50 – Group secretary to invoice AgShows NSW office.

1. The exhibit needs to fit within a **square (1m x 1m) maximum size**
2. An item using patchwork and quilting eg. Bag, table runner, cushion cover, quilt.
3. Framed and board mounted exhibits not permitted.
4. Must be either hand and/or machine pieced and quilted.
5. Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
6. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
7. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level.
9. If, for any reason, a winner is unable to compete at Group level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
10. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show.
11. An exhibit that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
12. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select a suitable quilted patchwork and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
13. Group Final location and date is to be determined by the Group. It is the responsibility of either the exhibitor or the Show Society to ensure the quilted patchwork is delivered on Judging Day and collected in an appropriate time frame after the competition.

  - Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
- All articles/garments must contain a minimum of 80% sheep wool, excluding lining, to qualify for competition.
- Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
- A sample of the yarn**, fabric or fibre with label **must be attached** to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
- An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
- All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.

AS FAR AS POSSIBLE THE TARALGA AP&H ASSOCIATION WILL IMPLEMENT THE FOLLOWING  
DRAFT GUIDELINES FOR JOHNE'S DISEASE:

Have in place a management plan to minimise the risk of transmission of infection. The following guidelines are based on there being no residual faecal contamination from any previous use by eligible animals. If the facility cannot be adequately decontaminated since last being used by other eligible animals (e.g., not a solid floor with appropriate washing and drainage capabilities) then the rules for Movement of Cattle to Other Places will apply.

- a) Where cattle from herds that have not been assessed under the NJDMAP are allowed entry, they should be housed separately from cattle from assessed herds. Cattle should also be separated from the other eligible species (i.e., goats, alpaca and deer). If separate buildings are not available a 2-3-metre space and a wall should be positioned between assessed and no assessed cattle in the one building. This separation should prevent traffic of stock, machinery, and people and contaminated water, bedding or feed. Assessed and non-assessed cattle should have no common watering points, feeding points, washing points, tie-up points, or isolation areas. Different coloured ear tags or tail tags may be used to differentiate animals from assessed and non-assessed herds.
- b) Animals should be individually fed and watered from above ground facilities.
- c) All cattle should be tethered when not being led to restraint hem within their allocated areas. This is especially important for young calves.
- d) Faecal material should be removed promptly to a place to which stock do not have access.
- e) Veterinary officials will call for isolation of scouring cattle if Johne's disease is considered a risk.
- f) Advise exhibitors of the above guidelines and that they should reduce the risk of infection by transporting their stock only in well-cleaned trucks and in trucks where mixing of cattle of unknown status will not occur.

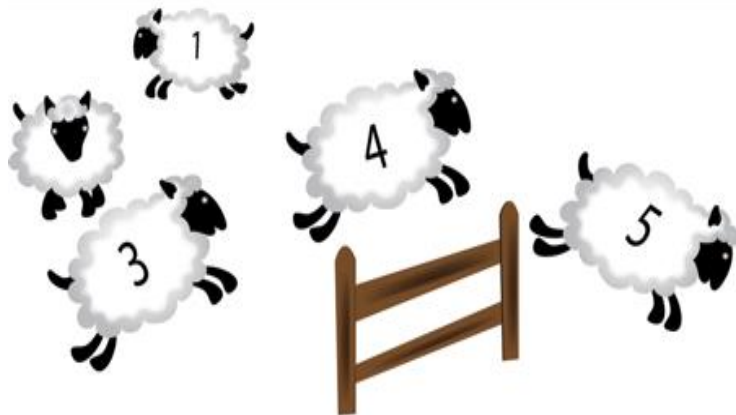

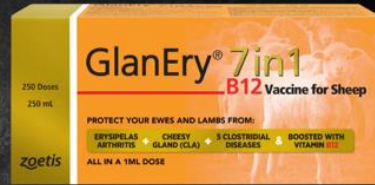

# Horse Show Regulations

**\*All competitions at this show are governed by these regulations and by the AgShows NSW Rules for Discipline in Horse Sections at Shows which can be viewed at [www.agshowsnsw.org.au](http://www.agshowsnsw.org.au). Should it become necessary for the AgShows NSW Disciplinary Committee to open an inquiry into any aspect of competition in this Horse Section, this Society will support any penalty imposed by that Committee as a result of the inquiry and will support penalties resulting from enquiries arising from Horse Sections at other NSW shows.**

## **COMPETITION RULES**

All Horse Competitions will be conducted under approved Peak Body and Breed Society Registration Rules and Regulations.

**INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS:** The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Taralga A P & H Association Inc. and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age. ALSO, all competitors must complete a Horse Health Declaration, each horse with which the competitor has brought onto the Showgrounds must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show. If the Show Society has introduced online entries, it is possible to electronically sign a Waiver and Horse Health Declaration (by ticking a box) at point of entry.

**Under Saddle Age Limit:** AgShows NSW recommends a lower age limit of 3 years of age (as at the date of the competition) for leading rein and 5 years of age for independent riding.

**Refusal of Entry/Alteration of Schedule/Prizes:** The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason for doing so and to alter the schedule to meet emerging circumstances. The Society is not responsible for the non-delivery of sponsor's trophies/prizes. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right to isolate, refuse entry to and/or remove the exhibit from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.

**Judge's Decision/Discretion:** The judge is empowered to withhold any or all prizes in any class where the exhibits are, in his/her opinion, unworthy of the prize, and always the judge's decision will be final. A judge has the discretion to ask that a led or performance exhibit and handler / rider / driver be ordered to leave the ring if he/she considers the animal is unruly and/or likely to cause an accident.

**District/Local Classes:** Horses and/or riders must have been resident for at least three months prior to the show within a 75-kilometre radius of the Showground.

**Novice Class Eligibility:** A Novice has not won a First Place at any Show in a similar class.

**Ridden Show Hunters and Ridden Show Hacks:** At the beginning of each calendar year an exhibitor MUST choose the category for their exhibit, EITHER Show Hunter or Show Hack, when competing at an AgShows NSW Affiliated Agricultural Show or supplementary event.

**Stallions:** Led Stallions and Colts must be wearing a bit at all times (unless Breed Society rules specify otherwise). Stallions and Colts must be under the control of a person 17 years of age or older. They must always be supervised and securely fastened when tied to the outside of a truck or float. They are not eligible to compete in ridden classes unless their eligibility is specifically stated in the schedule.

**Ponies with Adult Riders:** Ponies may be ridden by adults unless otherwise stated in the schedule.

**Lateness to the Ring:** Competitors must be ready when called. Once judging has commenced, a competing horse shall not be led, ridden, or driven into or out of the judging ring without the permission of the judge and/or the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.

**Leaving the Ring:** If a led horse should drag or escape its handler or a ridden or driven horse takes control of or unseat its rider and leave the ring, it is usually disqualified from the class.

**Horse Measuring:** No official measuring will take place at the show, but, if a question about height arises, proof of height may be required. In the absence of proof, a decision will be at the absolute discretion of the Ring Master or Chief Steward.

**Breed Registration:** Registration documents for horses in breed classes must be produced when required by a Steward. It is the competitor/owner's responsibility to ensure relevant memberships for their exhibits Breed society or registry is financial at time of competition.

**Attire:** Competitors must be appropriately attired for the competition in which they are competing.

**Helmets:** Every rider is encouraged to wear a safety helmet compliant with the current Australian Standard. Riders under 18 years must wear such a helmet. Some EA affiliated events require Rider's helmets to be tagged prior to competition.

**Footwear:** All competitors must wear appropriate footwear when leading or riding a horse. When riding, the footwear must enable removal of the foot from the stirrup.

**Cruelty:** Persons who are considered by the Ringmaster or Chief Steward to be abusive or cruel to a horse will be expelled from the ground. No horse will be permitted to compete if, in the opinion of the Ringmaster or Chief Steward, it is in poor health or condition.

**Drugs:** Drug testing may be carried out at this show. Any competitor found to have breached the AgShows NSW disputes & disciplinary regulation will be investigated by the AgShows NSW disciplinary committee.

**Approaching Judges:** No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging except through the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.

**Prohibited Relationship:** No competitor will present for judging before a judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has, or has recently had a personal relationship or has had horse related business dealings during the past twelve months.

**Coaching:** Any person detected coaching a competitor while that competitor is being judged may be removed from the Showground.

**Proper Conduct:** Any person who behaves offensively on the Showground may be expelled from the ground. The matter may be investigated by this Show Society and/or the AgShows NSW Disciplinary Committee and penalties may be imposed.

**Protests:** A protest or complaint against any exhibit or exhibitor may be lodged verbally with the Ringmaster or Chief Steward no later than ten minutes after the judging of the exhibit or exhibitor. The Ringmaster or Chief Steward must be provided with the exact nature of the complaint and act, if necessary, to maintain competitive fairness. The Ringmaster or Chief Steward may choose to refer the matter to the Protests Committee, which shall comprise the President of the Society, or a Vice President and two other members of the General Committee. A protest or complaint or an appeal against the decision of the Ringmaster or Chief Steward may be lodged in writing with the Secretary no later than 10pm on the day of judging. Such protest, complaint or appeal shall be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which shall be forfeited if the protest, complaint, or appeal proves to be frivolous or vexatious. A matter lodged this way shall be dealt with by the Protests Committee within 24 hours of lodgement and the decision of the Protest Committee shall be final. NB: No protest or complaint will be considered if it refers simply to a judge's decision.

**Veterinary Costs:** In the case of an exhibit requiring veterinary inspection/treatment whilst at this event exhibitors agree that all costs incurred are their responsibility.

**Age of Horses:** The age of all horses shall be calculated from 1st August in the year in which it was foaled.

**SPORTING CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

- o All events will be run in accordance with the rules published in this schedule.
- o Senior events are reserved for riders 17 years and over.
- o All events will be timed.
- o The Sporting Chief Steward's decision is final – NO protests.
- o A horse cannot have multiple riders in the same event.
- o The use of foul language will lead to immediate disqualification.

**FLAG RACE**

- o There will be a cask and five pegs with detachable flags on each.
- o Distance between the pegs to be 6 metres and from the cask to the first peg 8 metres
- o Spacing between lines of pegs to be 12 metres and there will be no limit to the lines of pegs used.
- o Each competitor must take the furthest peg first.
- o If a competitor knocks down a cask, he is to re-erect it before continuing.
- o Should the competitor fail to lodge any flags in the cask he must pick up the flag, remount, replace the flag in the cask and finish.
- o Each competitor must keep to his own line of pegs. A line of demarcation will be drawn or shown 6 metres on each side of each line of pegs and each

competitor must keep within these lines. Crossing these lines will mean disqualification. Should a competitor while crossing these lines interfere in any degree with another line of pegs, another competitor or their horse, they will be stopped as speedily as possible and rerun, but the competitor causing the infringement will be automatically disqualified.

### **BENDING RACE**

- There will be five pegs.
- The distance between the start line and the first peg will be 8 metres and between pegs 6 metres. Spacing between the lines of pegs to be 12 metres and there will be no limit to the lines of pegs used.
- Each competitor must leave the first peg on his/her right.
- Each competitor must keep to his/her own line of pegs. Crossing through other lines will mean disqualification.
- Knocking any peg down will mean disqualification.

### **BARREL RACE**

- Barrel distances are as shown on the sketch. Barrels are to be 44-gallon size drums.
- The starting and finishing line and the position of the barrels must be marked permanently for the entire fixture.
- A 5 second penalty will be added for:
  - Each barrel knocked over
  - Each barrel touched by hand
- A flying start is allowed.
- Watches used to be in at least tenths of a second.
- In determining the first 3 placings, if any horses registered equal times, the horses concerned will be re-run to determine their placings.

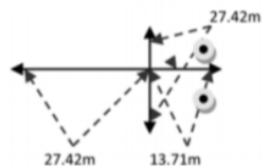

## SHOW JUMPING CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- A junior rider is a rider who is under 17 years of age on day of competition.
- All riders must wear riding boots and an approved helmet always whilst mounted.
- A horse/rider combination can only enter two consecutive height classes. i.e.  
(Junior – 185 & 186 or 188 & 190)  
(Open – 187 & 189 or 191 & 192)
- A horse/rider combination may enter only one class in concurrent classes i.e. A combination may enter class 186 put on a different horse the same rider may also enter class 187.
- Only one rider may ride each horse.
- Protest must be addressed to Ground Jury in writing, accompanied by a \$50 fee and be lodged no later than 30 minutes after the announcement of the results of the relevant class. The period of jurisdiction of the Ground Jury is 60 minutes after the announcement of the results of the class. The fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- The Committee reserves the right at the absolute discretion, to alter or amend any of the conditions, regulations, prize money, class sizes or any aspect of the event as they see fit.
- The Committee reserves the right at their absolute discretion, to accept or refuse any entry.
- Entry fee is 10% of the prize money offered.
